We rescue vulnerable children from the streets, giving them shelter, food, healthcare, water and sanitation, education and love. These children also receive long-term support to overcome the root-causes of their destitution.

With your support we have helped street kids to grow into confident young adults who can provide food, shelter and education for their own children. Some of our graduates have become teachers, doctors and social workers, determined to give back to the next generation.

MfM has long recognised the interdependence of people and their environment. Through education, training and practical support we enable farmers and forest-people to provide for their families, whilst also protecting and restoring their fragile environment.

You can help us to restore Madagascar’s disappearing rain-forests by sponsoring our reforestation programme. By joining-up isolated pockets of primary forest we can help save flora and fauna from extinction.

In Madagascar children dream of the chance to get an education. But for many the obstacles are too great. Remote rural schools lack everything from classrooms, water and toilets, to teachers and books. The children themselves are often too hungry or sick to study and the parents can barely afford the fees.

MfM brings hope to Madagascar’s forgotten children through our Education for Life programme providing: classrooms, water, toilets, books, teacher-training, environmental education, kitchen gardens, school canteens and solar power.
