# ACHIEVEMENTS & TECHNICAL PERFORMANCE

## BACK TO SCHOLL (AVM & WTDM)

- ❑ 1,275 students and 180 parents in 16 schools benefited from the Back-to-School initiative;
- ❑ We improved student retention and learning conditions.

## TEACHING AND LEARNING PATHWAY

- ❑ Training of 98 teachers (in 14 schools), creation of 14 school libraries, with 1,267 books distributed.
- ❑ 1,796 of the 2,572 students enrolled passed to the next grade, representing a success rate of 70%.
- ❑ 76% (303 of 345) is the CEPE 2025 success rate (with three schools achieving a 100% success rate: EPP Ambaralamba, Antanetilava, and Ambohijafy II).

## FOOD AND ENVIRONMENT PATHWAY

- ❑ 10 Vermicomposting and school gardening trainings : 4,692 participants (62% women),
- ❑ 55 functional vermicomposting installed
- ❑ Ten school gardens ( $\approx 35 \text{ m}^2$  each) were established,
- ❑ 10 nutrition education sessions: 3,848 participants (75% women).
- ❑ 10 school canteens operational, serving 2,917 students.



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## FOOD AND ENVIRONMENT PATHWAY

- ❑ Compost produced via vermicomposting: 315 kg in total, including 110 kg (in Quarter 3).
- ❑ 3,800 people trained in agroecology, gardening, promoting local products and tree planting.
- ❑ 537 trees planted in schools, 50% of which are fruit trees.
- ❑ Income Generation: 280 fruit trees distributed to parents in beneficiary villages (100% fruit species).



## WATER PATHWAY

- ❑ A total of 3,719 participants (62% women) took part in hygiene training sessions, including 723 parents, 79 teachers, and 2,917 students. These sessions focused on practical hygiene practices at school and home.
- ❑ Were distributed: 2,917 toothbrush and toothpaste kits, 280 menstrual hygiene, and 20 cartons of soap (two per school) to support regular handwashing.
- ❑ Distribution of WASH equipment
- ❑ Reduction in absenteeism (from 6.82% to 4%) and dropout rates (from 3.98% to 2.28%).
- ❑ Increase in interclass and CEPE exam pass rates.



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## LITERACY AND NUMERACY PATHWAY

- ❑ **144 previously illiterate parents** (64 % women) completed a 10-month literacy course across **8 schools**,
- ❑ The program concluded with a **certificate ceremony and the distribution of starter kits and seed materials** to help parents apply their new skills through micro-projects and income-generating initiatives



## INCOME GENERATIVE ACTIVITIES

- ❑ **1,810 parents received technical and material support**, including fruit trees (200), worms (25 kg), compost bins (100), and equipment for market gardening, poultry, and tailoring.
- ❑ Parents practiced improved farming, agriculture and vermicomposting techniques,

- A total of 9 public primary schools in five regions (Vakinankaratra, Analamanga, Bongolava, Itasy and Alaotra Mangoro) are benefited from the installation of WASH infrastructure.
- Beneficiaries : **1,524 pupils, 51 teachers and 800 members of the FEFFI** (parents' association and school management committee)
